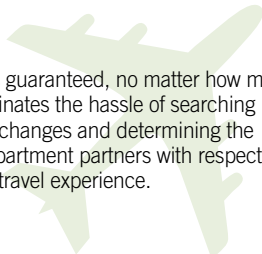

Cruising the Inside Passage

Cruise the Inside Passage along Canada's scenic west coast into Alaska's more sheltered Inside Passage, an island-dotted waterway edged by verdant forests, mountains, and glaciers.

Ketchikan, Alaska

Built around salmon canneries and sawmills, Ketchikan was once proclaimed the Salmon Capital of the World. Not far in the distance is the Tongass National Forest—the nation's largest—abundant with wildlife and the peaceful aura of the North Country.

Juneau, Alaska

Founded in 1880 when Joe Juneau and Richard Harris struck gold, the thriving town of Juneau offers an eclectic mix of people and pastimes. The downtown streets feature upscale shopping with a traditional twist among authentic Alaskan totems and art, while spectacular mountain scenery stuns from every angle.

Cruising the Hubbard Glacier

A journey to Alaska would not be complete without viewing Alaska's longest tidewater glacier. Enchanting visitors with its towering magnificence and sparkling shades of blues, the majestic Hubbard Glacier is more than six miles wide where it meets the ocean.

Icy Strait Point (Hoonah), Alaska

Wilderness and tribal traditions intertwine in Icy Strait Point. Its notable cannery provides a glimpse into Alaska's more recent history, while bears, eagles, and humpback whales make up a population that outnumbers everyone. Nearby is culturally rich Hoonah, a fishing village for hundreds of years and home to the largest Tlingit Indian settlement in Alaska.

Skagway, Alaska

Located at the northwest end of the Alaska Marine Highway, Skagway was known as the gateway to the gold fields. Today this delightful town retains the flavor of the gold rush era and the character of colorful inhabitants such as Soapy Smith, the "King of the Frontier Con Men."

Sitka, Alaska

Historically significant and vibrantly multicultural, Sitka is the storyteller of some of the state's most compelling history. The city's fascinating museums house some of Alaska's oldest native culture collections, and the Sitka National Historical Park boasts totem-lined forest trails and authentic artisan exhibits.

Victoria, British Columbia, Canada

Rich with British heritage and overflowing with cosmopolitan charm, Victoria is a town where High Tea and world-class flower gardens are part of everyday life. Here in western Canada's oldest city, Victorian and Edwardian-era mansions stand near elegant shops offering the latest in European fashion.
